



Project Lifesaving Funding Guidelines

Project Lifesaver is a tool to assist law enforcement to locate missing persons. There is a fee to enroll and a monthly service fee to cover the cost of administration, bands and batteries payable directly to LoJack, a partner with Project Lifesaver. The Center for Autism and Related Disabilities at USF has some funding to support the enrollment of individuals with autism spectrum disorders who are at risk of unsafe wandering, who have a history of wandering and who have no other financial means to enroll in the program. Families can request assistance by following these guidelines and submitting an application with CARD-USF. LoJack and other community organizations may also have funding support available.

Application Guidelines

1. All applicants must be registered constituents of CARD-USF living in Hillsborough County.
2. Applicants must explain the need for participation in Project Lifesaver (see application).
3. Applicants must explain the need for financial assistance (see application).
4. Applicants are encouraged to submit funding requests prior to enrollment.
5. Applicants may only be funded one time.
6. Applications will be reviewed and applicants will be notified of the status within 3 weeks of receipt.
7. Applicants agree to abide by the Project Lifesaver guidelines, including monthly maintenance, and return the equipment when it is no longer needed so it can be shared by additional enrollees.
