 All About Speech & Language (AASL) serves clients from as young as 18 months and into adulthood


• AASL accepts Tricare or private pay but can also provide you a paid invoice to submit to other insurances for you to seek reimbursement

• When you call AASL, no matter what <u>extension</u> you leave a message on, someone

will return your call within 48 hours.

When I get to All about Speech & Language, we will walk through a large set of doors on the Orange Building.


When we walk in the door, we will have to go up to the second floor. We can use the elevator or the stairs to get there.






The door for All About Speech & Language is at the end of the hall. I can read the sign to make sure I am in the right place.











When I get to All About


Speech and Language I will wait patiently in the waiting room until my therapist is ready for me. I might hear the air conditioning fan when I get there, if it bothers me I can bring headphones or cover my ears.





I will stay in the waiting area with the adult that brought me until it is my turn. I will not go through the gate into the therapy space until it is time.

When I am in the therapy rooms with my therapist, I will listen to what she says. I will use gentle hands with my therapist and with the equipment.






If I am in a social skills group, I will make sure that I follow the rules for social skills groups. They are written down so I won't forget.

- 7. Have Fun!




Meet the All About Speech & Language Team

Occupational Therapist


