• All About Speech & Language (AASL) serves clients from as young as 18 months into adulthood


• AASL accepts Tricare or private pay but can also provide you a paid invoice to submit to other insurances for you to seek reimbursement

• When you call AASL, no matter what <u>extension</u> you leave a message on, someone


will return your call within 48 hours.

• The AASL Experience requires parent communication and involvement to be successful. You can read more about your role here: The AASL Experience


• There is a hypo-allergenic dog at the office named Gracie, who is trained as a full service dog.



Today I will be visiting All About Speech & Language for my speech therapy, occupational therapy, or a social skills group.








When I get to All about Speech & Language, I will have to walk with the adult that brought me to the back of the building. I will hold the hand of the adult that brought me and stay close to them.

When we walk in the door, we will have to go up to the second floor. We can use the elevator or the stairs to get there.







If I have to use the bathroom, there is one at the beginning of the hallway that we will come in from. It may look like this bathroom is only for men because of the sign on the side, but this bathroom is for anyone at All About Speech & Language to use. There is a special code to

The door for All About Speech & Language is almost at the end of the hall. I can read the sign to make sure I am in the right place.







When I get to All About Speech & Language, I will wait patiently in the waiting room until my therapist is ready for me. I will stay in the waiting area with the adult that brought me until it is my turn.




When I am in the therapy rooms with my therapist, I will listen to what she says. I will use gentle hands with my therapist and with the equipment, toys, and games.



At the end of the session my therapist may make copies in the materials room for my home practice. She will then talk to the adult that brought me to therapy back in the waiting room. After they talk, we will leave the office and head back down to the car.




Meet the All About Speech & Language Team


Jenna enjoys spending her free time with family and friends, exploring new places, and cheering on the Florida Gators!


