
Our Visit to...

- This social narrative is meant to help children with autism spectrum disorders (ASD), sensory processing differences, and/or anxiety prepare for a trip to the library.
- The library has a limited number of sensory-tools available at the Guest Services desk, to borrow as needed.
- There is an expectation of quiet at the library.
- If the library does not have the materials you are seeking, talk to a librarian. They
 may be available in a virtual format (ebook), or through another library location
 (interlibrary exchange).

Maybe I am going to the library for a Story Time group.

In group, we will listen to a story and do activities. We might sing songs, play games, or do a craft. I will meet other kids there, too.

Ms. Alexa is the group leader.
I will follow all of Ms. Alexa's
instructions. It is important to be a
good listener at group so everyone
can have fun and stay safe!

Or, I might be at the library to explore.

My first time at the library can be a little confusing.

That's OK! I can ask someone who works at the library for help.

These workers are called "librarians."

They can show me around and help me find what I'm looking for.

I can also talk to the librarian about getting my very own library card! This card allows me to check out materials from the library. "Check out" means I will borrow them for a short time and then bring them back.






There are all sorts of materials I can check out from the library-books, DVDs, CDs, magazines, newspapers, and games!




The library is organized by sections.
There are sections for New Books,
Adults, Children, Fiction,
Non-fiction, and more!





The signs overhead and on the aisle ends can help me know where to go.







This area in the library is the **Children's Section**. Here I can sit quietly and read, play games on the touch table, or do an activity. I can also look for books or DVDs I might want to check out.

The fiction books are sorted by reading level. The non-fiction books are sorted by category. For example, if I want to find books about Space, I will look for the "Space" divider!

This shelf is part of the library's Honor Program.

I do not need to use my library card to borrow the books, games, and puzzles on this shelf.

I will look at them at the library, or take them home, and return them when I am done!






This is the Friends Store.

The books, movies, and music in this area are for sale.

If I decide to buy something from the store, I can keep it!


The money goes to the library.



I may want to use a computer at the library. I can use the computers to look things up online or do homework.

One computer is just for finding books at the library.
This is called the "Card Catalog" computer.





When I have found everything I want to check out, I will go to the back of the library.

I can check out my items with a librarian at the Guest Services desk, or I can use the check out computer station. The librarian or computer will ask for my library card. They will also tell me when I need to bring my items back. This is called the "due date."

After I check out, I can take my materials home to enjoy! I will bring them back when I am done, so other people can have a turn.
